Happy Spring and Almost Easter!

Some of us are glad that the snow is retreating to the edges of the trees while some of us are still hankering for one more ski down the slopes. Some of us are feeling the drawing hope of new life while for others of us it's a season that draws us down in sadness.

Spring is a tricky season. An in-between time of messiness and mud, of new life and the cost it takes to find it. Whatever this spring season it is for you, it is a special season for us to come together in all the ways we are and to walk through the passage of Holy Week and Easter. It's a familiar journey that we repeat every year, a walk through broken hope, failed promises, betrayal and desertion that leads to a familiar and all too human story of shame, despair and death. We'll share soup, bread and communion and remember the Jesus' last supper with his friends.

Good Friday, April 7, 6:30pm in the Sanctuary

We join with the Lisbon, Bath and Franconia Congregations to mark Good Friday as we reflect on the meaning of Jesus's life and death.

Easter Vigil, April 8, 8 – 10pm at United Community Church, St. Johnsbury, VT. We'll join an Easter Vigil worship service with United Community Church in St. Johnsbury. Let me know if you'd like to ride over with me. We can meet at the church at 7:15pm.

An Invitation from the Diversity Task Force of the Church Council

For the past three months, we have been meeting as a small task group formed by the Church Council to learn more about what the Bible has to say about diversity and welcoming all as beloved children of God. While our conversations initially focused on sexual orientation, we have also read materials on gender identity, marriage and what it might mean to be a community that welcomes all of us in our diverse experiences.

Through our study and conversations these past months we are all better informed and want to learn more with you. We have learned about the experiences of others that are different than our own. We have grown in our empathy and care. We have learned about making a safe and brave space for conversation about topics that we disagree on.

We believe that we are called to love our neighbor as ourselves. We believe we are called to do unto others as we would have others do unto us. We believe that we all are welcome to Christ's table and that in our baptisms that we are reminded that we are all God's beloved. We believe in engaging in these conversations together we can grow as a people and a church. We know that we want to have a conversation about topics we might not agree on and that we learn to listen and speak as a community of love to and with one another.

A short pamphlet "Homosexuality and the Bible" by Biblical scholar Walter Wink will be a resource for our conversations.

While we will be meeting in a hybrid format (on zoom and in person) after church on these days. We want to include you but if you can't attend – let us know a day and time that might work for you and we will hope to gather another mid-week group together.

Title: Loving Our Neighbor: A Conversation on the Church, Bible and Diversity.

Goal of the conversations: To promote a conversation on diversity for the sake of being a more welcoming community for all. To learn more about the role of the Bible in shaping our lives and decisions. To learn about the experience of others and so challenge ourselves and grow in our understanding and faith in order to see all people as beloved children of God.

Timeline: 45 minute sessions after church from 11:30-12:15: April 16, 23, 30, May 7, 14 and 21. We are open to having an alternate time to meet as well. Let us know if that would be more convenient for you.

April 16: Introduction: Why are we offering this series of conversations? Why do we think this is important? What are our goals for this conversation? Sharing our stories.

April 23: "Made in God's Image" – Bodies and the Bible.

Together we'll create a safe and brave space for conversation.

What does it mean that we are "made in God's image?"

How do we read and understand scripture?

How might we talk about the gifts we have received and our own struggles of being embodied persons and being "made in God's image"?

What questions do you bring?

Why might we talk about our experience as embodied persons at church?

How have the terms for our experiences changed over time?

A great time to bring your questions about the expressions and representations of who we are and how they change.

May 7: Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and the Bible

What is sexual orientation?

Why might it be helpful to talk about?

What does the Bible say about sexual orientation and being beloved children of God?

What does the Bible say about marriage?

May 14: Gender Identity and the Bible

What is gender identity?

Why talk about it?

What does the Bible say about gender identity?

May 21: Where do I stand? Where do we stand?

Tolerance, Respect, Open, Affirming, Advocate, Ally?

How do we individually and as a community relate to each other in our diversity and difference?

What might it mean to be a welcoming congregation?

Why might we want to be?

Where do we hear God's call?

Where then do we go from here? What are our next steps?

We have other conversations we want to have as well about our embodied experience including reproductive rights, neurodivergence (including autism and Asperger Syndrome), race and class. We hope you will join us as we continue to learn and explore what it means to be the body of Christ and beloved children of God.
