# Listening for the Holy Spirit

As we wrap up Eastertide and approach Pentecost, I am reminded of the first few chapters in Acts that describe the disciples, after Jesus is taken up into heaven, waiting and waiting. Jesus told them to wait for "The gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about," referring, of course, to the Holy Spirit. But I wonder if they really knew what that meant. I imagine them being quite fearful and not knowing what to do, while they were trying to remember all that Jesus had taught them.

It feels like we are in a similar place. Some of us are fearful about what will become of our church. Some of us are hopeful because we are seeing glimmers of new energy and excitement. Some of us are confused because we are not sure of the direction this church is going and feel we lack information. Some of us are all of the above.

The church council meets monthly and for periodic retreats wrestling with the same questions. We are working really hard with Pastor Peter to discover who we are, what is God calling us to become, and who is our neighbor. What does it mean to be a small church in this time and place? We have been tapping into resources, workshops, and conferences. We are making connections with others who are in a similar position and have discovered that we are not alone. We are all struggling to discern what it means to be church in 2023. Most churches in UCC are small (under 100 members). What does that mean going forward? What does life as a small church look like? What if growth means something other than bodies in the pews? The NH UCC has set up "A New Thing Task Force" with gatherings throughout the conference as an opportunity to learn from each other. The next one is May 20 at our church, and you are welcome to attend.

It seems like the questions beget more questions. Next steps beget next steps. This all takes time. The council is hoping to come up with some working goals for the next 3-5 years. As this process shakes out, you, the congregation, will be kept informed. We need your input and feedback. What are your questions? When you listen for the Holy Spirit, what do you hear? Please feel free to speak/email to any council member. Come to a council meeting (let moderator know in advance so we make sure you will be heard). Please know that your concerns are being brought to council meetings when you speak to any of us. We may not have an easy or quick solution, but these questions do help shape discussions on moving forward.

All that said, we are continuing to reach out into the community with Dinner Bell, Food Pantry, and SLLC. We have been welcoming some new people who have found their way to our sanctuary on Sunday morning. Through workshops, Bible study, and connecting with others, we explore, consider, pray, and listen for the Holy Spirit. It is a messy process with information, like strands of thread for a tapestry, lying all over the place, waiting to be woven into a new picture that will be the First Congregational Church of Littleton.


