

From What Is to What If?: A Fall Worship Wondering

Our world needs imagination. Climate change and other crises facing us today have been called by some a "failure of the imagination." What was working before wasn't "bad", it just isn't life-giving or working in the way it used to before. A new way is being asked of us but we are not sure how to step into and find that new way. What's needed? Imagination. The ability to see things as if they could be otherwise. The ability to wonder and be curious about what we are doing and why and play with different ways to live into our call and joy.

It's both an exciting and challenging time to be living and to be church. One of the most exciting things for me is that it's a time that asks all of us to step into the work of imagination. We all can name places in our wider world where new and yet undiscovered ways of living together and on our planet are needed. And we need that same imagination in our personal lives as well.

Sometimes we know we need to make changes, but aren't sure how to step into them. We know that we are in some stuck places and we need to find a new way through, but don't know how. Imagination is what opens the doors to what if and what is possible. Imagination asks, "I wonder how I might live with more joy today even amidst the challenges of life?" Imagination asks, "I wonder how I might get the support I need and yet keep the things in my life that I treasure and don't want to lose?" So many questions we all live with in our own ways.

In October we will help each other make space for our imagining. We will introduce the "Imagination Sundial" based on the imagination work of Rob Hopkins in his book, <u>From What is to What If.</u> Hopkins has identified four key components that help stir our imaginations:

Space - Mental and emotional space that expands our capacity to wonder.

Place - Gathering places that provide platforms for collective imagining.

Practices - Routines that connect us and change our frame of possibility.


Pacts - Collaborators and partners that catalyze imagination into action.

It's striking how these four elements are embodied in our everyday life as church. We gather in a sacred place each week, both in person and in our connection on-line; we take time in that hour to make a special space together and opening ourselves to the Spirit's presence with us; we engage in practices like singing, prayer, scripture, stewardship, communion among so many others that connect us and change us; we depend on our neighbors in the wider community to help us live out our call and ministry.

In the next four weeks, we'll wonder on each of these particular ways that imagination takes root and grows. We'll think about practices that can help each of us grow in our imaginations and as a community together.

Each Sunday we'll focus on a text from the Minor Prophets. The prophets often speak in a strong "counter-voice" to the very things we are seeking. They speak forcefully against empty practices and shallow connections that neglect the real needs and dreams in our community. In speaking against the "false idols" they name, they seek to clear the way forward to all that is possible in God's imagination. The prophets were never popular and for sure some of these texts are harsh and disorienting. But the point of their words is not to shut their hearers down but to open them up. As we ponder their words, may they stir us to open our imaginations so together we can dream of all that God is calling us to be as people and the church.

Food Collection Sundays are Back!


