### **Report from the Church Council**

Dear church members and friends,

This month we celebrate Pastor Peter's first year with us as interim minister and begin this next season of his designated term ministry with us. We are grateful for his leadership in worship and with the various committees and task groups we have created to address issues that have arisen. However, there is more to do. When we first called Peter, we asked him to help us discover how we can become the people that God wants us to be in this everchanging world with all its challenges. In our current culture, coming to church on Sunday morning, participating in the business and the missions of the church, and supporting the church financially is no longer a priority, especially for young people. How do we share the Good News of Jesus Christ in a way that is relevant and understandable to the people of this community? How do we serve the people of this community with the resources that we have? How do we nurture our faith so that we can be God's hands and feet?

During this past year through a series of retreats, the church council has been working on how to answer these questions by stepping back and examining:

- 1. Who are we?
- 2. Who is our neighbor?
- 3. Who is God calling us to be?

These are broad and difficult questions, but it is hard to imagine moving forward without understanding the answers. We have reported our discoveries to you in previous Steeple Minutes and will continue to seek your input. As a result of this process, there were three things that came through as needing to be addressed over the next year. Therefore, the council has recently come up with the following goals and objectives to move us forward:

- 1) Empower, Equip and Support Lay Ministry Leadership.
  - a. Skill Building at Church Council monthly meetings and quarterly retreats.
  - b. Lay worship leadership training and practice to expand our pool of worship leaders. Working with partners to collaborate in this on-going learning and practice.
- 2) Define and Develop Goals: Scope and Plan for a Community Outreach Assessment.
  - a. To define the role of leadership and a consultant.
  - b. To develop and implement outreach opportunities to engage/experience and learn about community strengths, needs and opportunities for partnership.
  - c. We do not see this work as solely an intellectual exercise but an investigation in which we will learn through relationship building and active engagement with others.
- 3) Expand Communication and Connection with the wider community.
  - a. Assess and implement digital ministry. Set goals for evaluation.
  - b. Start one experimental community building/worship service for 12 months. (For example, an outdoor worship service or a dinner table gathering/worship service.)

This is where you come in. Only with everyone working together can we achieve these things. Some things we will try, and they will not necessarily be successful, but even there, we will have learned something. Where do you see yourself in this picture? Is the Holy Spirit nudging you? Is there one thing you can do? The church council will be having another retreat on October 14<sup>th</sup> where we will see how we can start implementing some of these objectives. Soon we will be asking the congregation to join in the discussions and projects as we work together in Jesus' name. As we move forward, we ask for your prayers for this church that we can truly become light and salt in our community.
